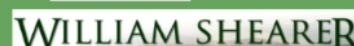



As many of you will be aware, it's been several weeks since we first confirmed that a stoat was present on Rousay, and we want to provide an update on what we've been doing in response and to thank everyone for their support so far.

What's been happening?

Following reported but unconfirmed sightings by visitors in April, we quickly put our incursion response plan into action, which involved placing traps and cameras near the location of the sighting and conducting a dog search. On 7 May, while checking the images captured by trail cameras deployed near Muckle Water, two images of a stoat were discovered. We immediately intensified our response.

Since then, ONWP staff, supported by incredible volunteers from the Rousay community, have been hard at work. The team has been regularly setting up new traps and cameras (including AI-assisted cameras) and checking them, as well as checking traps which were already there as part of our existing biosecurity efforts.

We've also carried out detection dog searches across parts of Rousay, with a focus on the area around Muckle Water. These searches have found stoat scat (or droppings) at several places around the loch as well as a few locations to the north of Rousay – some of these finds were clearly a few weeks old, but one was more recent.

Our cameras have taken several more photos of stoats too, mostly in the vicinity of Muckle Water but with one at Kierfea Hill. There have also been three new potential sightings including one on 13 June near the Loch of Wasbister, and one on 20 June to the south of Muckle Water.

While it is entirely possible that this is one individual stoat roaming between the south and north of the island, we need to be absolutely certain. To do that we need to move to having surveillance over a much wider area. This will not only increase our chances of catching the stoat but crucially will help us to confirm this is definitely a single animal.

How did the stoat get to Rousay?

We don't know how the stoat got to Rousay. Stoats are excellent swimmers, known to be able to cross more than 3km over open water, so a stoat could easily cover the distance from the west mainland to Rousay. It's also possible the stoat was accidentally transported to the island or that someone chose to break the law and release it. Evidence of how a stoat came to be on Rousay may emerge over time but for now efforts are focussed on finding and removing it.

Why does the arrival of a stoat matter?

Even by Orkney's high standards, Rousay is an important place for nature, particularly for breeding seabirds, and birds of moorland, lochans and peatland, like curlews, red-throated divers, hen harriers and short-eared owls. It's also one of the islands in Orkney that is home to the Orkney vole – found nowhere else on earth.

The arrival of a stoat poses a huge threat to native wildlife and is devastating news for the community and Orkney as a whole. Invasive non-native species threaten wildlife on islands

across the world and are responsible for nearly 90% of all recorded extinctions on islands. We are all pulling together to make sure that the damage this invasive non-native predator can do to Rousay's native wildlife is limited, alongside the eradication efforts elsewhere.

Facing the challenge together

That no stoats have spread to other islands until this point is a huge success of the ongoing collective efforts to protect Orkney's native wildlife and parts of the economy that rely on it including a thriving wildlife tourism industry. By continuing to work together, we can tackle this new challenge.

Thanks to the diligence of the visitors letting us know they may have seen a stoat, and the support of people on Rousay continuing to report sightings and volunteering as part of the response team, we have been able to respond quickly and gain more information about the situation we face.

To date, no stoat has been trapped on Rousay. We are continuing to respond with the full range of tools and methods available to us including dog searches. There are currently more than 60 traps and nearly 30 cameras (including five thermal AI cameras) in the field as part of the response, alongside the biosecurity traps that were already present. And we are increasing the number of traps and cameras each week.

We want to say a huge thanks and warm welcome to new volunteers that have joined the efforts recently. Alongside our other incredible volunteers, they are assisting with trap checks as well as the mammoth task of collecting and checking images from the trail cameras.

In an emergency, or if you have an urgent medical problem that cannot wait until the Surgery is open, please contact the Balfour Switchboard on 01856 888 000 and ask them to page the Rousay Nurse Practitioner.

As we approach the date for our migration to a new IT system, we ask all patients to ensure they have an adequate supply of medication in plenty of time. We are hopeful that there will be few periods when we are unable to order medication, but we would recommend ordering the week beginning 24th August, if you would normally be ordering in the week beginning 31st August.

On a related note, we have seen a recent increase in the number of patients asking for prescriptions to be emailed to the Community Pharmacies in Kirkwall. We would like to remind patients that this is a service that is provided **for emergencies only** as it causes a large increase in workload for both pharmacy and surgery staff. Please note that running short of medication alone is not necessarily considered an emergency, as this will depend on the nature of the medication and why it is prescribed. Patients are reminded that the minimum expected time for receipt of prescriptions from ordering is one week, and we recommend ordering two weeks in advance in case of delays.

Medication can be ordered via email, and we would encourage you to do this, where possible.

Stephen Clackson's Letter from School Place

A report from your councillor on his exploits both within Orkney and without.



Whilst in Eday to attend a meeting of their community council, I got the opportunity to see the trophies on display at the island's heritage centre won by the Eday war memorial (see photograph above) in Royal British Legion Scotland's Best Kept War Memorial Competition. Thanks to the dedication of Moira Byers, it won both the New Entrant Award and Champion of Champions! (There was an article published about the win last year on page 3 of the 2nd October issue of *The Orcadian*.) Let this be an encouragement to other islands to smarten up their memorials and enter them for the competition.

Other meetings I attended in the Isles this month included those of Westray Community Council and Sanday Parent Council. The police held a surgery on Sanday, and I called in to thank them for coming out and to speak to them about the recruitment of special constables in the Isles. Also held on Sanday was the Fifth Annual Show of the North Isles Dance Academy, and Charlotte Hoque has been doing an amazing job training up dancers of all ages and abilities from the community and ensuring the Academy lives up to its geographical name. On North Isles Sports day, I'd been invited to Rousay School to help count votes at the AGM of the Rousay, Egilsay & Wyre Development Trust, where I got to see the displays showcasing community activities and projects and enjoyed catching up with ward constituents, plus I got a tour of their impressive school garden.

At the meeting of the Education, Communities & Housing Committee, I congratulated Dr Petra McLay and her staff on the good evaluation report Stronsay School received from HMIE inspectors when they visited in March. Other meetings I've been to in Kirkwall include those of the Monitoring & Audit Committee, and a National Emergency Board "People's Emergency" briefing, and I participated in the Public Service Reform Orkney Leadership Gathering event (see photo below) attended by members and officers of OIC, the Integration Joint Board and NHS Orkney. The oft spoken about "Single Authority Model" is not one I am comfortable with, as I don't want councillors to be finding themselves in the impossible position at budget-setting time of having to decide how to allocate resources between, for example, pothole repair and palliative care. And I do not want to see our National Health Service becoming fragmented and Orkney receiving a second-class "Local Health Service".

Not ideally for Isles residents, Orbital Marine Power's Westray tidal array public consultation event was held on an afternoon and evening in Kirkwall. As I had an early ferry to catch, I went along before the event started in order to explain our concerns about the proposal's potential effects on shipping along a key route for our lifeline ferry services. I believe they got the message, and they also understand the need to get out to the Isles to speak to people. To put our concerns in context, the site is situated in the Westray Firth between Egilsay and Eday right on the route for ferries sailing to Westray, Papay and North Ronaldsay, and also a route used in bad weather by ferries serving Eday, Sanday and Stronsay. Outwith Orkney, I've travelled to Glasgow for a meeting of the Scottish Councils' Committee on Radioactive Substances (on which I represent OIC) and to Lerwick for a meeting of the Orkney & Shetland Valuation Joint Board.

I would like to remind North Isles residents that many are entitled to a Smartcard for local concessionary ferry travel, for instance when they turn 65. (Residents of North Ronaldsay and Papa Westray can also receive concessionary entitlement for inter-island air travel.)
